

Admissions and Recruitment

Northwest Territories:

High school applicants from the Northwest Territories must meet the following minimum requirements for admission to the Bachelor of Arts program at St. Thomas University:

- High school graduation (by end of August of the year in which they apply);
- Minimum average of **70%** on five successfully completed Grade 12 academic courses, one of which must be **English Language Arts 30-1**;
- Four remaining academic electives chosen from the list below (please note that, where they exist, AP, IB, enriched courses and any of the following electives offered in a French Immersion program are acceptable as substitutes for courses listed below). Grade 12, academic Languages (5 credits) will also be considered as admission electives.
