	appear top right, ½ inch from the top of the page may or may not appear on first page (ask your professor)

_ _ _	click Insert → Page # (insert it top right) place your cursor before the page number type your last name, followed by one space if your professor does not want headings or page numbers to appear on the first page, make sure the "Different First Page" option is checked, and perform the above steps on the second page of your document

	titles of full-length works appear italicized (e.g. books, films, journals) titles of shorter works appear in quotation marks (e.g. poems, chapters, journal articles)

Quotations

quotations that run 3 lines or less can be included within paragraphs
o for poetry, use forward slashes to indicate line breaks:
e.g. In her poem, Humphreys calls attention to "how we lose responsibility / for meaning—the blank, common jargon of cults and / talk shows."
quotations that run 4 lines or longer should be formatted apart as block quotations
all lines in block quotations should be indented 2 tabs
place your in-text citation after the block quotation
